
Given the essential importance of forests in mitigating the effects of climate change, since 2011 the Council of European Foresters has kindly asked the European Parliament and the Commission to set up a Commissariat for Forests or a General Directorate for Forests within the European Commission. The Council of European Foresters reiterates this proposal in 2020.


CEF, AGFEE and EFAS give a special appreciation to the activity of the Agriculture Commission to respect and apply the principle of subsidiary in the forest sector for all the Member States of the European Union, as long as there is no forest authority in the European Commission.
